A Fond Farewell to Fr D

When I first became Principal at St Paul's PS in 2008, I returned to an area I knew well from my student days at St Mary's University College. I was appointed in part by the parish priest at the time Fr Alexander. However, within a short while, a new Parish Priest was installed, one Father Anthony Devlin. Known by everyone as Fr Tony, little did I know what a huge part of my life he was to become.

From the very first meeting I had with him those many years ago, it was clear that we were going to get along just fine. We seemed to share a similar sense of humour and an energy to get too much done in too short a time. Fr Tony guided me through my first Principalship right up to 2015 when I left for pastures new. I didn't realise it at the time but after a few years, I again found myself back in the parish of St Paul's in the heart of the West. I was appointed Principal of our great school in October 2018 and once more my relationship with Fr Tony was renewed.

Fast forward to 20th May 2023. It was First Holy Communion Day at St Paul's Church and everything was as it should be. Little did we know how the coming hours would unfold. What started out as a day of celebration later became one of worry and anxiety when Fr Tony took ill on us. Over the coming weeks and months, we as a parish watched on with prayerful hope as Fr Tony began his long road to recovery. We ourselves knew that the most difficult thing in the world would be that he had to slow down and let time and expert medical treatment speed his recovery.

A number of weeks ago Fr Devlin called myself and Mr McNamee, the Principal of St Paul's, together to tell us the news that his time in St Paul's Parish would be coming to an end. For both of us, it was a shock but at the same time we realised it was the right thing for him.

Very few people get to see at close hand the work that a Parish Priest must perform. Not only his ministry duties but also as Chair of our Board of Governors. St Paul's is a huge parish in the heart of the City and with that comes many demands on time. Fr Devlin would never speak of or concern us with what he was dealing with on any given day or night. However, if he was to be in school, he made sure that he was there regardless.

As a chair of the Board of Governors, I have never known anyone who has assisted a Principal and a school staff as much as he has. His generosity is unparalleled and is extended to every member of staff. His characteristic organization of every one of the liturgical services is something we will remember him for with a smile. He was not a priest to just turn up on the day but he himself planned every single detail and ensured that he was the one to carry out every single rehearsal either in the church or in the school.

It is the children of the school that were his pride and joy and I suspect gave him the highest rewards of his work. He placed all the children at their ease and they enjoyed every time he visited the school either formally or informally. And it is the fact that he visited the school so often that stands him out as a person who cares deeply for the young people as the future of the church. The pupils' faith journey was all important to him. It is fitting that his last day in the Parish will be with our pupils celebrating their First Confession on 5th March.

For 15 years I have known Fr Tony as a Chair of Board of Governors, as a parish priest and most importantly as a dear friend. I can't imagine the parish without him being around and to play his practical jokes on me. However, I know the parishoners of Dunloy are so lucky to be receiving a wonderful faith leader, a mentor and guide and just a thoroughly good person. We wish him every success on his next adventure. 1st of March a Special Day of Celebration

Friday 1st March will be a sad day for all of us as Fr Devlin will be spending his last visit with us in the school. The pupils, staff and invited guests will come together to celebrate mass in the school assembly hall alongside his brother Fr Patrick Devlin and his family. The Board of Governors will also have one last meeting with our outgoing Chair on that day. Fr Devlin has asked the pupils be given a special treat of finishing early on this day. School dinners will be served as normal on this day and all pupils will finish school at 12.30pm to allow for the staff to have a final meeting with Fr Devlin.

P3 First Confession

As previously stated, Fr Devlin's last act as our Spiritual Director will be to conduct the sacrament of first penance with our P3 pupils. This will take place at 11.00am in the church. All parents are asked to be seated in the Church by 10.45am. Pupils will be walked to the church from school. As is the norm, pupils will be allowed to leave with their parents after the ceremony and have the rest of the day to celebrate with their families. We would like to thank all those parents who attended the ceremony of enrolment at the school earlier in the month. It was a beautiful occasion and was a wonderful way of preparing to receive the sacrament.

P7 Transfer Meetings

Over the course of the month of February, Mr O'Doherty had the pleasure of meeting with all the parents of the P7 pupils who are transferring to post primary school in September. It was very much appreciated that parents provided all the necessary information in order to complete the application forms online. Now it is an anxious wait until Saturday 18th May when the school allocations will be announced. At this stage it should all be emailed to parents via the same portal as the results have been given. Mr O'Doherty will be available in the school on the morning of the 18th itself to answer any queries you may have. P7 parents are reminded that the parent portal for editing information as evidence for applying for Post Primary will close on the 22nd February.

Choices & Changes


An introduction for 9-10 year olds to the physical and emotional changes they can expect during puberty, offering support as they explore and develop an understanding about the choices and changes in their lives.


