### School Visit from the Education and Training Inspectorate (ETI)

On the 15<sup>th</sup> May, members of the ETI visited the school. Due to industrial action across all schools, lessons were not observed so determinations could not be given. However, our Safeguarding was explored and part of this was a discussion by the Inspection Team with a selection of our P6 and P7 pupils who reported to them how happy and safe they felt in St Clare's and they knew who exactly to go to if they have any concerns. This was reported back to the Principal and the Board of Governors.

#### **Education Cuts and Implications**

Here in the Newsletter, we try to make this a publication which celebrates the achievements happening within the school. However, it is important to highlight the devastating cuts to the education budget and what that means for you our parents.

Among the funding streams that have been lost includes Extended Schools which helped pay for Breakfast Club, 123 Club, after school activities such as sports and arts and of course the summer schemes. While the school has always supplemented the costs of these, the withdrawal of funding is making it impossible for us to fund these activities by ourselves.

We have given an obligation to our pupils that we will continue to fund these activities until the end of June. The management team of the school is proactively working on how some of the projects can continue. This may mean a rise in contributions for Breakfast and 123 clubs and for summer schemes. The Principal will try his best to keep costs as low as possible and supplement these schemes as much as the budget will allow.

There will be an announcement on the arrangements by the middle of the month when it is more clear to us what we can afford. As a school we are devastated at not just the loss of extended schools but engage funding also.

#### **Book Fair**

Thank you to all our parents and pupils who purchased books and literacy resources from the Book Fair this month. Over £1500 worth of stock was bought and the school now receives a substantial voucher to purchase more reading materials for across the school. Thanks Mrs Shaw for organizing.


