And in the blink of an eye, the summer is over and we are back to the new academic year as the weather changes and the nights are drawing in.

In terms of routine, nothing has really changed. Our start and finishing times are the same as before with all classes finishing at 2.00pm on a Monday. Breakfast club is open every morning at 8.15am and is a very popular club amongst the pupils. As well as getting a well balanced and nutritional breakfast, it is a super way of beginning the day in a more relaxed setting. Our kitchen staff put a lot of effort into the food and we thank them for their service.

123 club has also recommenced from 2.00pm-3.00pm each day. This club is specifically for the children who have an older sibling in a KS2 class. It helps the parents if they do-not have to come up to the school twice in an hour.

Nursery and P1 Starting School

There has been great excitement across the school in the first few weeks back especially for all our new starts. We have been amazed with the ease in which all our pupils have begun to settle in. Today (Monday) our P1 pupils are in for the full day for the very first time. They have successfully lined up and made their way to the school canteen as if they have been always doing it. We want to ensure that the pupils get into their routine as quickly as possible. The same applies to the nursery where the pupils are all looking smartly dressed in their new uniforms. It is so heartening to see so many of the pupils happy to march into the nursery each morning.

Seesaw will continue to be used to inform parents of how their children are getting on. This will include pictures of the children at work.

In order to help foster good independence, from tomorrow (Thursday) we ask that all P1 pupils are taken only to the gate and we will escort them to the classroom. This enables the school to manage any anxiety which the children may have when leaving their mum, Dad or grandparents.
