Transfer Test News





Message from the Principal Online Social Media Platforms

Like any other school, our pupils at St Clare's can be distracted by the excitement of sharing information on various social media platforms. Sites such as TIKTok, Snapchat, Facebook and Twitter can draw our pupils in so easily. I am aware of many of our children especially in P6 and P7 who are regularly engaging with each other over these platforms.

In the past, and again as in all schools, we have serious issues to deal with when inappropriate and hurtful things are shared online. We must remind our children of the dangers which they can be exposed to. These media platforms are not suitable for children in Primary Schools.

It has been brought to my attention that there are several TikTok channels operating under the St Clare's PS logo. These have not been endorsed by our school and we urge all parents to be vigilant and to monitor what their children are accessing on the internet.

I have spoken to all the classes in P5-P7 and reminded them that should anything hurtful or inappropriate be shared about any pupil in St Clare's, I will be dealing with it as a bullying incident. This includes the setting up of WhatsApp groups where sometimes children can be bullied or excluded.

I thank the parents who have already contacted me to tell me how they are constantly monitoring their child's internet and social media platform experiences. Working together we can maintain all our pupils' safety online and in school and help our children to continue to feel safe and happy.
